



School uniform with effect from 1st September 2018

The uniform:

- It identifies students with each other and as members of The Garibaldi School community
- It is associated with the high standards of work, conduct and dress we set for each of the students
- Most importantly, it is worth emphasising that in recent years it was the students at the school who wanted to develop a more formal uniform

School uniform

- Official School blazer
- Plain white shirt with collar – that must be tucked in at all times, with the top button fastened (can be short sleeved; no soft collar or polo shirts)
- Official clip-on School tie – that must be worn at all times (except PE)
- Optional official School grey school jumper
- Plain black trousers
 - **No** leggings, jeggings, tight fashion trousers or skinny trousers
 - **No** denim or cord material
- Or plain black skirt **must** be knee length
 - Plain black tights **must** be worn with a skirt, **no** socks or patterned tights
- Black shoes (no trainers/pumps/UGG boots/Doc Martens etc)
- A plain dark coloured outdoor coat (no hoodies, tracksuit tops, denim or leather jackets)
- School bag
- Natural hair colour

PE uniform

- Official School grey PE polo shirt
- Plain black shorts
- Plain black socks
- Trainers that offer suitable support, either laced or Velcro (plimsolls must not be worn)

PE Optional extras for colder weather

- Official black waterproof/fleece lined jacket
- Plain black tracksuit bottoms
- No hoodies, jumpers or tracksuit tops

If your child is unable to do PE for any medical reason, or has the incorrect kit, a note must be provided, explaining the problem; they might still be asked to help officiate in a lesson.

Students must not wear

- Jewellery (except one stud in each ear - no other body piercings are allowed)
- Excessive make-up
- Caps/hats, in lessons or around the School site
- Trainers or other similar sports and designer clothing

Students who persistently fail to meet uniform expectations may be referred to SWAT so that contact can be made with parents/carers and suitable sanctions put in place.
